On my walks I see that all of our lawns are growing again, and it is a good time to begin getting them back in shape. Like me, I see some of you have added seed to your bare patches and begun focusing on trimming the edges. # THE RESIDENTS OF MILLPOND TRACE JULY 2024

Wow! It's been HOT HOT HOT! Yet, despite the extreme heat, much has been happening at Millpond Trace. These are just a few areas to highlight: the stairwells, mulching, and pet concerns. Let me briefly summarize these features.

Firstly: Essential maintenance and repair work on the stairwells of our buildings has been accomplished, and all steps and landings of our stairwells have been prepped and treated with the Sparta Chip coating. A Sparta Grip additive was added to the resin coating to provide traction when the coating surface is wet. Our stairwells (22 of them!) have hopefully been made safer and they most assuredly look great.

Secondly: Key areas along our front entrance, down Hardwick Dr., and in front of our buildings have been replenished with red mulch. This will contribute to the health of our shrubs and plants, and the overall park-like atmosphere of our grounds.

reminding our owners and residents of our pet policy. We are also authorizing appropriate signage to further remind and alert prospective owners, and visitors as well as our residents that we do in fact have pet restrictions and will enforce them to the degree we are legally able to do so.

Before biking, verify that you have all the right equipment and don't forget to wear a helmet.
